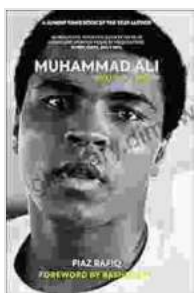


Muhammad Ali: The Life of a Legend

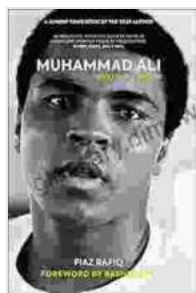
